Suffrage is Ratified by Tennessee. Nashville, Tenn., Aug. 18—Tennessee today became the thirty-sixth state to ratify the Susan B. Anthony federal suffrage amendment.

The constitutional change will become effective in time for the twenty millions or more women of the country millions or more women of the country to vote in the presidential election in November, unless the lower house of the Tennessee assembly resciuosi its action of today in adopting the ratification resolution. 48 to 47.




